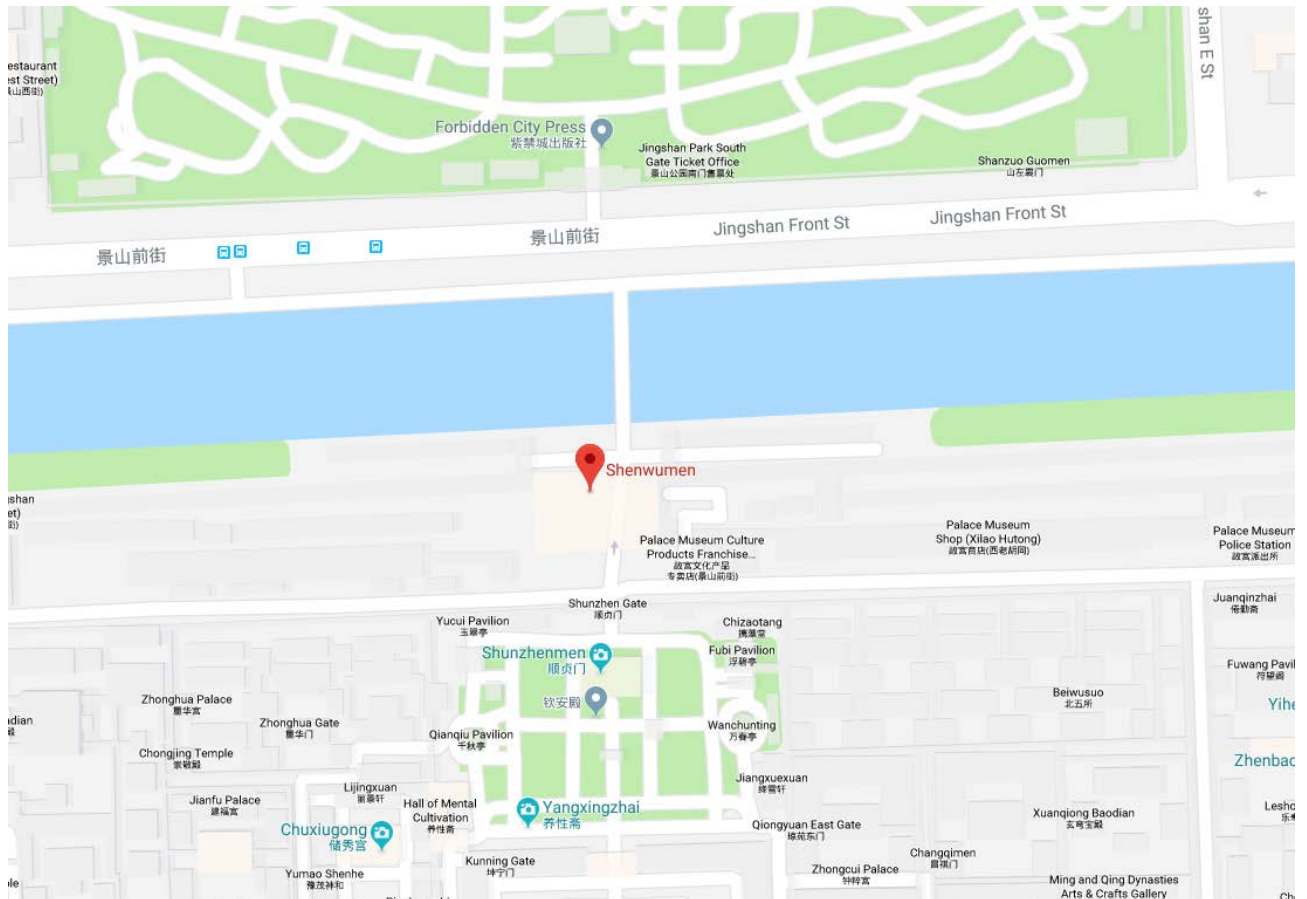


Figure A1. Map of the meeting point --- northern gate of the Forbidden City (故宫北门神武门)







### Baiwanzhuang, Xicheng district, Beijing

Baiwanzhuang is located in the northwestern part of the second ring road. Construction was finished in 1953, and it was among the first batch of work-unit compound or danwei constructed after the foundation of the Peoples Republic of China in 1949.

Baiwanzhuang served as the residence for the government officers and Dormitory of National Textile Factory. It has a total area of almost 21 ha.

Residential buildings are mainly three floors, and public buildings are two floors. The structure is brick construction with wooden truss.

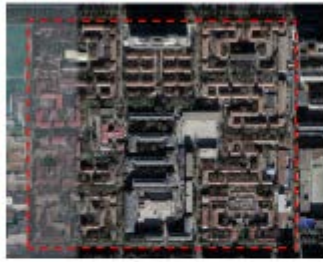

Baiwanzhuang was constructed under the influence of the Soviet-Style Perimeter block, which was adopted soon after the failure to borrow Clarence Perry's Neighborhood unit urban model.

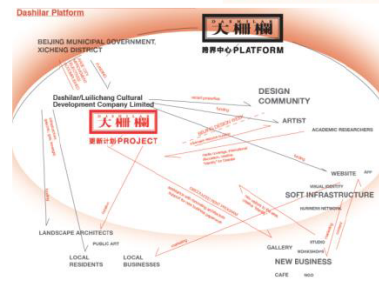
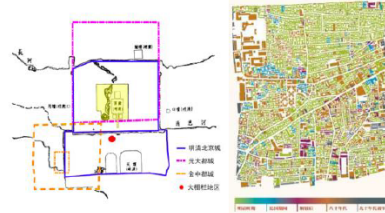
